Guideline for Peer Review Policies (Research Opinions in Animal & Veterinary Sciences)

Peer review is an important process that helps to ensure quality of research work. We greatly appreciate the contribution of the referees who have reviewed our articles and the article they publish. The peer review process of the ROAVS is kept confidential. A manuscript after initial evaluation of suitability is sent to at least two reviewers. The invitation letter includes the title, abstract and key words. In case the reviewer agrees, a full article along with the evaluation sheet is sent to him/her. It is hoped that the guideline presented below will help the reviewers in the peer review process.

Questions to have in mind when reviewing the manuscript:

- 1) Is the manuscript of the quality and the contents are novel, you expect to see in a first-class international journal?
- 2) What are the strengths and weakness of the study?
- 3) Is the major innovative point of this study clearly explained and even included in the abstract section?
- 5) Does the author give sufficient credit to related work?
- 6) Are all tables and figures necessary?
- 7) Does the manuscript need language revision?
- 8) Is the discussion and conclusion are well balanced and reflect the data of the manuscript.
- 9) Do you recommend this paper, both from the standpoint of its originality contribution and way of presentation, as being appropriate for publication in Research Opinions in Animal & Veterinary Sciences?
- 10) Is there any ethical or competing interest issue that you have noticed during the reviewing of the manuscript and would like to raise?
